The Story - Chapter 27, Easter

GETTING STARTED_____

1. What does Easter mean to you personally? Do you have a tradition from Easter that you can remember when you were a kid?

Are there things about the first Easter that are challenging for you to grasp?

2. The true meaning of Easter is celebrating the resurrection of Jesus. When did Jesus become more than just a story to you? Take a moment and share with your group.

3. Thomas is frequently referred to as “doubting Thomas” because he refused to believe his fellow disciples’ testimony. Then, a week after the resurrection, he confessed, “My Lord and my God!” Do you think Thomas’ reputation is justified or do you think he has been labeled unjustly? Why or why not?

DIGGING DEEPER_____

1. People have always had difficulty believing that Jesus was God in the flesh. Read **1 John 1:1, 2:22** and **4:2-3**. What details did John include in the crucifixion story for his readers to know for certain that Jesus, fully human, had truly died?

What are some things that create doubt in your mind as it relates to the life of Jesus? How about in other areas of your life?

How does knowing that God came to live among us affect your daily life?

4. In **John 18:17-27**, we see the denial of Peter. What parallels can you find between Peter’s denial story and his restoration story?

2. List everything you know about Jesus’ resurrection. Why is Jesus’ literal, physical resurrection a non-negotiable teaching of the Christian faith? (See **Romans 1:4, 4:25** and **1 Corinthians 15:17**.)

What does Peter’s restoration reveal about Jesus’ heart and how does it apply to you personally?
